7. Equity Adjustment for Staff

Leedom discussed the history behind her recommendation. After a short discussion, it was M/S/C to accept the recommendation of the ad hoc committee to approve a onetime equity adjustment of 4%, effective January 1, 2009, for the Retirement Benefits Manager and the Retirement Accounting Manager. 8. Retirement Deputy Chief Executive Officer

10. Miscellaneous

(a) Staff Report - Leedom reported she is having issues with CCCERA's current Fiduciary Liability Insurance carrier. She noted staff is in the process of locating another carrier.

Leedom noted staff, counsel and the actuary are working on a possible revision of the Interest Crediting Policy. She performed a brief survey of other '37 Act counties; providing a short description of the different methods used to allocate interest to member accounts.

Leedom noted the first meeting in February will be an important meeting to attend. Segal will provide a presentation on market smoothing. She stated she has had a discussion with Dan Borenstein, from the Contra Costa Times, on fund returns. Leedom noted she invited him to the meeting in February to hear Segal's presentation.

Hally stated he received an update from ING Investments related to CCCERA's Equity Account with ING. He noted a copy of the letter is in trustees in-boxes. ING is changing their organizational structure and has released Omar Aguilar. Omar has been at ING for three to four years as head of their quantitative strategy. Omar's departure is very troublesome and cause for concern for ING Core Plus Investments. ING Core Plus is already on watch for performance; however, Hally felt there should be discussion on placing them on watch for organizational changes as well. He noted there will be a specific item on the next agenda for discussion regarding ING Investments.

(b) Outside Professionals' Report - <u>Leiderman</u> stated that some SACRS systems have been working with the IRS regarding the process for applying for Letters of Determination. The deadline for the government filing cycle has been extended to Cycle E, or until January 31, 2011. Staff and Counsel are in the process of collecting CCCERA's plan documents.

Leiderman noted he has agreed to provide a presentation at the CALAPRS Attorneys' Roundtable on municipal Chapter 9 filings. He commented he is happy to provide the same presentation for a future meeting and will provide written presentation material via e-mail to Board members.

(c) Trustees' Comments - <u>Hast</u> read an updated statement on the Mayer vs. CCCERA case as follows: On November 25, 2008, in closed session, the Board approved the principal terms of an agreement settling litigation, captioned Marita Mayer vs. CCCERA, Action No. 08-02630 in Contra Costa County Superior Court, and gave legal counsel and the CEO authority to finalize the settlement. On December 16, 2008, the parties' Settlement Agreement became final. In the Action the plaintiff claimed that she was entitled to additional service credit towards her retirement benefit, based on an alleged misclassification of her position by the County. The key terms of the written Settlement Agreement are: plaintiff would dismiss all of her classification claims against the County; and neither party will pay any amount to the other party. The action against CCCERA was dismissed on December 22, 2008.

<u>Cabral</u> - discussed a disturbing report on Money Management Letter regarding *CCCERA*'s issues with Western Asset Management. He noted Western Asset was terminated for the problems staff incurred with client services and not performance issues. Hally noted he has provided updates on Western Asset's transition at every Board Meeting and will continue to do so. He reiterated that Western Asset had also been on watch for performance before their termination.

<u>Viramontes</u> - thanked all for the sympathy and condolence cards she received for the death of her mother-in-law. She noted the reason she missed the December 10th Board Meeting and the Staff Appreciation Luncheon was because of her mother-in-law's death. She noted for the record, that the Bob Campbell who attended the December 10th Board Meeting, was not her husband, but a County employee, so there is no conflict of interest.

<u>Telles</u> - requested that the AFSCME Conference be agendized for the next agenda. He thanked all for closing the November 26, 2008 Board Meeting in honor of his father.

<u>Holcombe</u> - reported he attended the Public Funds Board Forum Conference in San Francisco last December. He noted it was a good conference. He learned a lot and wanted to thank the Board for sending him.
