1. Pledge of Allegiance

Telles led all in the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

2. Public Comment

Scott Daly from the Office of the Sheriff discussed his letter dated April 30th to Pollacek regarding a request to receive advance notice of travel plans for Board member Remick.

Kris Hunt executive director for Contra Costa Taxpayers Association spoke about the recent article in the Contra Costa Times regarding Board members' travel, asking that the Board take action on travel in order to set standards and limits.

3. Approval of Minutes

It was **M/S/C** to approve the minutes of the May 17, 2010 meeting. (Yes: Buck, Gaynor, Gioia, Holcombe, Pollacek, Telles, and Viramontes)

4. Routine Items

The Board moved into closed session pursuant to Govt. Code Section 54957 to consider the Medical Advisor and or staff's recommendation regarding disability retirement applications and to consult with counsel regarding potential litigation.

5. Disability Retirements

It was *M/S/C* to accept the Medical Advisor's recommendation and grant the following disability benefits:

(a) John Nunes - Service Connected Disability Retirement (Yes: Buck, Gaynor, Gioia, Holcombe, Pollacek, Telles, and Viramontes)

(b) John Orr - Service Connected Disability Retirement (Yes: Buck, Gaynor, Gioia, Holcombe, Pollacek, Telles, and Viramontes)

6. The Board will continue in closed session under Gov. Code Section 54956.9 (b).

The Board moved into open session.

7. Consider and take possible action on staff recommendations to issue an RFP for building management and leasing services.

It was *M/S/C* to approve the staff recommendation to issue an RFP for building management and leasing services. (Yes: Buck, Gaynor, Gioia, Holcombe, Pollacek, Telles, and Viramontes)

8. Consider and take possible action on Placement Agent Disclosure Policy.

Levy reviewed the revised Placement Agent Disclosure Policy and advised the disclosure requirement applies with regards to anyone within the statutory definition of a placement agent. In-house employees of external investment managers would only be considered "placement agents" if they are considered an "intermediary" within the statutory definition.

Regarding gifts and campaign contributions disclosures, the law does not place the requirement on the external managers, but rather on the placement agents. The Statute is also limited to elected officials while CCCERA's policy takes a broader approach to address contributions to staff, board members, and consultants.

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AB 1743, if passed, would require placement agents to register as lobbyists. It would modify the definition of "placement agents" such that any In-house marketing staff working for external managers not spending at least 1/3 of their time managing assets will be considered a placement agent.

Leiderman advised the language on Page 4, item #4 is required by law and any material violations are determined by the Board. The Board may provide in its policy penalties that go beyond the statutory penalty for policy violations. Hally commented that most investment contracts allow the Board to terminate managers for any cause, but penalties stricken from the policy would cause issues with private equity contracts.

A policy must be adopted and implemented by June 30th, 2010 and the Board will revisit once AB1743 passes, if necessary.

It was **M/S/C** to adopt and accept the Placement Agent Disclosure Policy. (Yes: Buck, Gaynor, Gioia, Holcombe, Pollacek, Telles, and Viramontes)

9. Consider and take possible action on recommendation from staff on IRS Letter of Determination.

Leedom provided follow up on Rothschild, noting New Mexico PERA terminated their SMID value mandate on April 29th, the day after Rothschild presented to CCCERA. Leedom noted the electronic version of the SACRS new trustee handbook is in Board member mailboxes.

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Cary Hally commented he will be in contact with Board members regarding upcoming onsite due diligence meetings.

Levy noted AB 1987 has been amended.

(b) Outside Professionals' Report -

Leiderman - pending AB 1987 will require substantial staff attention and time because it will require auditing of pay practices for all the retirement system employers.

Leiderman noted he will present on June 23rd to the Little Hoover Commission. A copy of the presentation will be emailed to Leedom for distribution to the Board.


(c) Trustees' Comments -


Holcombe commented that the Palmer letter has been reviewed.
